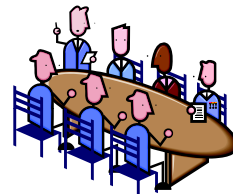

Business Architecture Review Board

GOALS

- Maintain Framework specifications
- Ensure continued partnership between CMS and States
- Incorporated changes with minimal adverse impact on States
- Ensure that business needs drive technology decisions
- Ensure a single, approved, “implementable” specification

BARB Activities for Last Year

- Met weekly.
- Reviewed and approved the 79 Business Capability Matrices (MITA contains business capabilities for each business process. The business capabilities show how the Medicaid operations of today (as-is business process model) evolve into the business operations of the future (to-be business process model).
- The finalized version of the BCMs are posted on the G-Forge web-site.

Future of the BARB

- To complete the business process model – this will be submitted to the BARB for approval.
- A training module session will be developed to get the BARB familiar with reviewing and approving UML Documents.
- The BARB will work with the group that is formed to develop business process models.
- It will take approximately a year to complete the review and approval of the business process model.

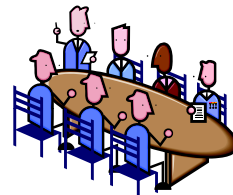
